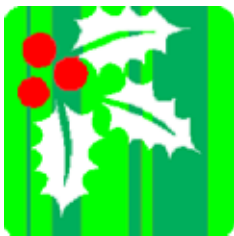

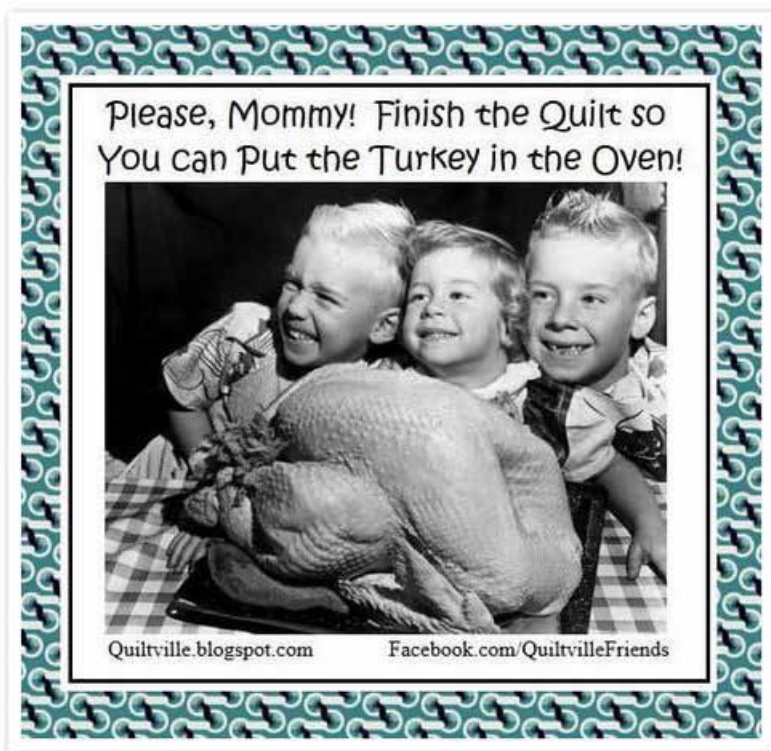
Round Robin Anyone: Wendy Ray

Correction: Tracy Wilson When making a canvas bowl, cut 2 layers of canvas, not one. Fuse each fabric circle to one canvas circle, then fuse the 2 canvas circles together. You will need to cut 3 large circles from the fusible web to do this. Everything else is the same. Have fun creating.

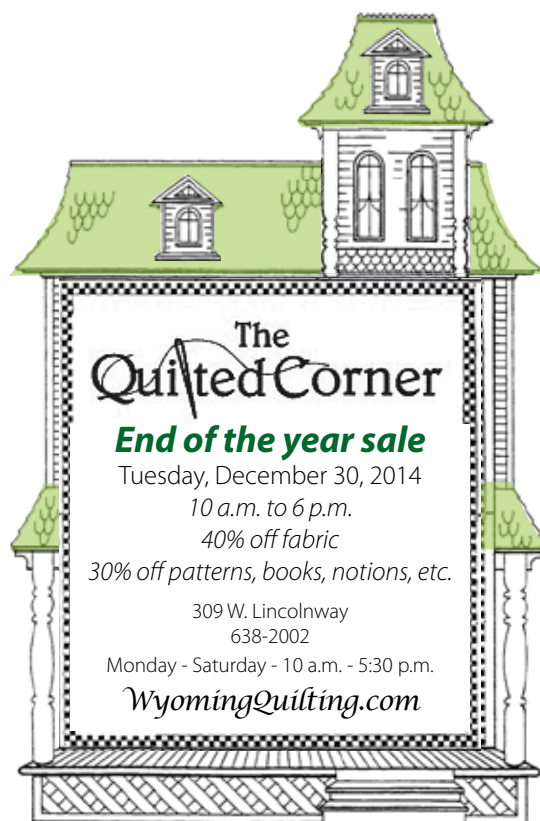

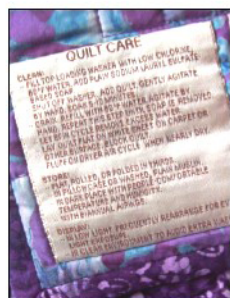

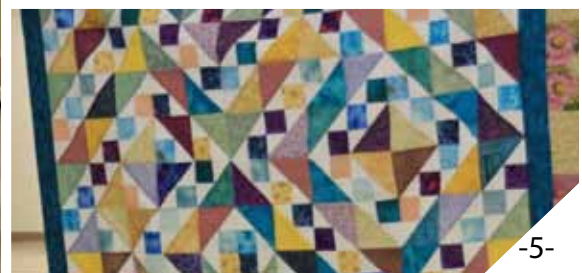

Wendy Ray discussed our Mystery Quilt; there will be a setting party on December 8 at the Laramie County Library, Cottonwood Room at 6:00 p.m. There are 3 ways to set the mystery blocks being worked on now by members.

Wendy Ray also discussed Round Robin. It will start in January. We will each find our own group, five people to a group. We should pick a theme. She passed out lists for sign-up. The second Meeting of November will be the last opportunity to sign up. There will be one month between exchanges.

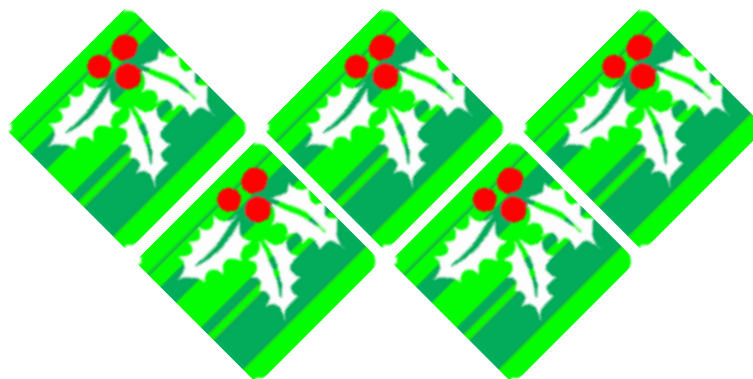

November 3, 2014: Janet Osborn's Toy Sewing Machines

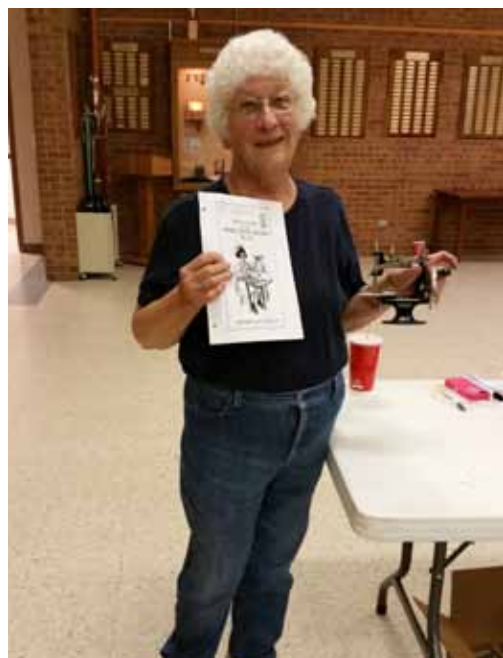

President, Sue Frerich opened the meeting announcing that treats were in the back of the room, provided by Lorraine Hutchison, Genelle Warner and Danette More. Guest were welcomed and introduced by Sue: Sue's question for the evening was "Share any tips and tricks you may have learned in a class". Everyone took about eight minutes at their table to discuss. **Announcements:** Sue Frerich reminded us that the treasurer has Club Pins for sale for \$5 and Cookbooks for sale for \$10. Linda Herget talked about the Quilt Show Meeting, held at 6 p.m. on November 3. She was happy to announce that all positions had been filled. All volunteers for the 2015 Quilt Show stood for recognition. No meeting will be held in December. The next Quilt Show meeting will be in January. All members are welcome to attend. Linda also announced that the Quilts of Valor group will meet on November 20, at the Quilted Corner at 10 a.m. - 9 .m. There were brochures on the tables regarding the Paducah Quilt Show in 2015, if anyone is interested. Sue brought up the subject of the Quilt Show dates, which had been chosen for 2015. The dates in August were once again going to conflict with the Rocky Mtn Quilt Festival in Northern Colorado. She opened the floor for discussion regarding concerns about the conflict and options. The group had concerns about low attendance and no vendors available. Their suggestions included more publicity, more demos, ticket sales, change hours of the show, having a Quilt Show every other year, change Show dates. After a brief discussion, Carol Gardner presented a motion to have the Quilt Show on the dates chosen and make it the best show we could under the current circumstances. The motion was seconded and approved by the majority in attendance. Wendy Ray was not in attendance due to weather. Sue Frerich sent around the signup sheet for those interested in participating in the Round Robin. The Mystery Quilt "Setting Party" will be held on Monday, December 8th at the Library in the Cottonwood Room. There are lots of Community Quilts to

be quilted, pieced and bound. Please see Carol Gardner if you are interested in taking a project home to work on. Our next meeting will be held on Monday, November 17. The program will be hand embroidery and Donna Dolan will provide needles, floss and fabric. You can bring scissors, thimbles, hoops, needle threaders, etc. if you want them. Judy Gilmore announced (for Tracy Wilson) that there is a change in the "bowl" pattern from last meeting and the change would be in the next newsletter. Lu Hart announced she had made cards for everyone who had signed up for Round Tuit and to see her if you had not gotten your card with the list of your projects.

Program: Our program was Janet Osborn showing her Toy Sewing Machine collection. Janet brought and shared a sampling of her collection of toy sewing machines. She started with her very first one that was given to her by her parents in 1941. She and her siblings used it to sew when she was a little girl. She told a little about each one and had cards prepared for each for all to read as they browsed the table. Janet has approximately 40 toy sewing machines and continues to collect them. Her favorite is her original one that her parents gave her.

Betty Kempter showed a bag she made (and is going to KEEP) and a Children's Quilt that is being raffled now. Sue Frerich shared the "3-D blocks" from her class in Houston. Lorraine Hutchinson showed the Pot Holders she finished after last month's meeting demos. Donna Grossbeck showed Linus and Community Quilts that her daughter worked on while visiting her.
