

Round Robin Anyone: Wendy Ray

What is a Round Robin? It is a group of quilting friends that take turns working on each others' quilt projects. To start, everyone in the group makes a center block, then the center blocks are passed to the next quilter in the group to make the 1st border. After the border is completed it is passed to the next quilter in the group for the addition of the second border and so on. After the last border has been added it is passed back to the person that made the center block. Now the owner can finish the quilt as she wishes.

When you sign up you are committed to meeting the deadlines and finishing the project. The whole group is depending on you.

This guild year's Round Robin will start in January and finish in May. If you are interested, find four other quilt friends, form a group, choose a group Leader and sign up. Don't worry if you can only find a couple of friends or you don't know anyone, just let Wendy know and she will find a group for you to join. You will be given the Round Robin Guideline/Rules first meeting in December. The second meeting in November will be the last sign-up date. 

The Crown of Maine quilters also sent us a small 5 and Dime quilt top as a donation to our community quilts.

Diane Harvey donated quilts to our Quilt Show 2014 Boutique and three of them didn't sell. It was suggested that they be donated to the Pioneer Home in Thermopolis, Wyoming. This was agreed upon by the membership.

Wendy Ray is in charge of our Mystery Quilt/Round Robin projects for this year. She presented some new



ideas for us and we will start out with a Mystery Quilt. The directions will be on our website and mailed to those who receive the newsletter by mail. Our only clue was, "It's a holiday pattern from 1996!" You will need three fabrics; a light, a medium, and a dark and there will be three sizes to choose from. We should finish the Mystery Quilt in December or January. Then we will begin the Round Robin project. Join in on the fun!

Carol Gardner, Community Quilts chairman let us know that our next meeting, September 15th, is the kick-off for this year's Community Quilts project. We will work on bindings and cutting squares for new quilts. Please bring your own sewing or cutting supplies. Squares will be approx. 8." Information about this year's project is listed on the website at the bottom of the page under the heading "Forms & Info.".

The Round Tuit committee consists of Lou Hart, Helen Jarvis and JoEllen Mass. Registration has begun for this years Round Tuits, and continues the next four meetings. You may sign up a maximum of three items you think you might finish this year-quite an incentive to get some UFO's done! When an item is totally finished, bring it to Show and Tell, indicate that it is a Round Tuit and you will receive a small prize. By the first meeting in May, all Round Tuit's should be finished. The second meeting in May, there will be a grand prize drawing from all the completed cards. Round Tuit pins are still available as well. The May 4th meeting will be a party to see all the finished Round Tuits, Mystery Quilts and Round Robins.

There are a multitude of books available for check out from the library on the first meeting each month.

Bea Dersham brought in freshly dug up iris bulbs for anyone to take home. They are the black ones! Thanks Bea!

The "Quilts Along the Platte" quilt show will be held in Torrington at the Goshen County Fairgrounds, September 19-21. September 15, 2014: Community Quilts

The September 15th meeting of Cheyenne Heritage Quilters was brought to order by our president, Sue Frerich. We had two new members, Shirley Stuart and Linda Price, and three guests including Donna Dolan's daughter and Ione Peterson's granddaughter. Ione's granddaughter told us about the baskets that she makes for donation to the NICU units at a Denver hospital. These baskets are given to patients that are in emergency situtations pertaining to the pregnancy and births. The babies are usually premies and the families often are not prepared for this early arrival. The baskets contain receiving blankets, a fleece blanket that is used to cover the incubators for warmth and quietness, a stuffed toy, a journal for the parents, nurses and whomever is caring for the baby to write what happened that day, a book, and premie onsies. Elizabeth also has started a foundation and accepts donations, both items mentioned and monetary donations. To date she has given away 109 baskets (in 9 weeks). CHQ cookbooks have been placed for sale at both quilt shops in Cheyenne. Patterns for our 2014 Opportunity Quilt are still available from the treasurer. Consider these items when making out your holiday lists. Lu Hart handed out the sign-up cards for the 2014-2015 Round Tuit project. Each participant is able to sign up three items that they would like to totally finish to be eligible for a prize. Sign-up continues until the second meeting in October. Linda Herget spoke about the 2015 Opportunity Quilt. Bea Dersham, Sandy Farrell and Linda Brunner asked members to participate in the project by making blocks and providing strips in the colors asked. Can't wait to see how it goes together. Contact any of them if you have any guestions. There will be a 2015 Quilt Show committees meeting before the October 6th meeting at 6PM at the church.Carole Gardner spoke about Community Quilts for 2015. She reminded us that any orphan blocks that we may have stored away would work for these quilts. She also asked that everyone who has a community guilt kit to please finish it and return it to her. The program for the evening was working on Community Quilts that needed bindings sewn, more blocks cut out and making a fleece blanket for Elizabeth Tolin. The conversation at the tables where binding was sewn was enjoyable. A good way to get to know each other. Participate!! Show and Tell followed. Betty Squire showed a beautiful quilt that she made for her daughter that helped her when she had surgery recently. The quilt was called "Picnic Grove" Betty also showed a wall hanging made with a panel and a border. Good Work Betty!! Liz Escabedo showed two quilts that she made from Jo Sunderman patterns. One was called "Miss Butterfly" and the other was called "Julianna". Beautiful Liz!!! Julie Tottingham showed a guilt that she had made for her brother. It was the twister pattern in blues and greens. As always, Great Job Julie!!! Ione Peterson was asked to bring her layered wall hanging that she had shown us earlier. It is a unique

work of art. It had several layers for the seasons of Christmas thru Easter. There were flowers that buttoned or unbuttoned to reveal the next flower. What a unique project lone!! With that, the meeting was adjourned.
