Newsletter: Judy Gilmore

I'm sure you've heard that Judy Gilmore will be stepping down as your newsletter editor soon. The August edition will be her last edition. That means CHQ needs some new folks to take over the newsletter responsibilities.

Recently the "Newsletter" tasks have been shared by a "committee of people" rather than being one person's responsibility. We now have "reporters" that write the **minutes** of each month's meetings. The editor sends these "reporters" an email reminder a week before the newsletter deadline.

We have a **photographer** that is in charge of taking photos of things that happen during the program and of show and tell. It is easiest if the photos are digital and saved to a removable card that the Newslestter Editor can take home after the meeting.

Another task that has been taken over by another is **Printing and Mailing**. After receiving the Final Draft from the Newsletter Editor, this person makes copies for those that don't have access to a computer, then addresses those copies and brings them to the 3rd meeting of the month. Any copies not picked up are then mailed. Right now we print less than 10 newsletters.

As editor I have been the **Advertising Contact**, but this job could easily be handled by another person and the ads then submitted to the editor for the newsletter. I will continue to be the Advertising Contact through the November 2016 issue of the CHQ newsletter.

Announcements: Sue read a Thank you card from Marci Baker who said she enjoyed giving her program to the guild. Sue also brought up the subject of elections. It is time to sign up if you would like to be an officer. A list was sent around and you can let Sue know if there is something you are interested in doing. The Harriman Retreat: April 10-12. \$45 for members, \$55 for non-members. Each person will be responsible to help with meals. Carole Gardner is setting up food committees. Our Next Board Meeting: March 23, at the Laramie County Library Sage Room. Next Quilt Show meeting will be the same day and place. The Annette Ornales Class: June 15. \$25 for members, \$35 for non-members. You will receive your supply list when you pay for the class. Community Quilts: Carol handed out six new kits. At the April 20 regular meeting we will be binding community guilts. Please bring your own needles and scissors. Lickety Stitch Quilt Store in Lusk is selling the bucking horse fabric. They are offering a 5% discount. Wyoming State Quilt Guild Retreat: April 24-26 at LCCC. Free. Bring your own food. Tracy Wilson will be teaching folded flowers or you can work on UFOs. Accuguilt Club: Added an additional group on the 2nd Saturday of the month at the Quilted Corner. Opportunity Quilt Tickets: Available. Each member is asked to sell at least one packet. The next Round Robin exchange will be April 6. Our guest that night will be Sherry Werum, talking about Revolutionary War Quilts.

Community Action was unable to attend our meeting tonight so Donna Dolan presented some highlights about the program. They are a social services organization. Their goal is to help people become self-sufficient. They maintain a veteran's apartment, a 16-unit apartment building, a four-plex and four individual homes. Suggested donations are linens and Christmas gifts. Donna set up a game called "Right, Left, Center." and provided the prizes. Some of us are very competitive! Announcements: Sue started by announcing that we received a new hands free microphone. This will be very useful for the new Guild President. We had no guests. Supper will be at 6 p.m. that night. Our Treasurer, Mary Ellen Little, will collect your money when you sign up. It was also brought up if you are a coffee drinker and going on the retreat to bring your own mug to cut down on Styrofoam cup use. The next announcement was about the guilt show; there is one challenge guilt packet left to purchase for \$15. The next quilt show

meeting will be on April 20 at 6 p.m. Since Michelle Condon is leaving, Linda will now handle the tickets for the Opportunity Quilt. Linda then briefed about Quilts of Valor. She said they will meet on April 16 at the Quilted Corner. They need backs for quilts as well as long arm volunteers to help guilt the guilts. Carole Gardner, our Community Quilts Representative, briefed that at our April 20 regular meeting we will be completing binding on community quilts, so bring some scissors, and your favorite needle to the next meeting. If you are interested in setting up a table to sell quilt related items at a "garage sale" that night, please contact Donna Dolan. May 4 will be our "graduation" meeting, where we will show off our Round Robins, Panel Projects, last Round Tuits, and Mystery Quilts. (Please note: the Mystery Quilts will have a section in the quilt show as well) Wendy announced that the Laramie County Library will have a quilt display again. She is looking for "First Projects". This would be your first table runner or your first guilt etc. They are also looking for "Holiday Themed" quilts. Finally they need volunteers to assist with hanging the display. Please contact Wendy if interested. Sue then brought up that Marsha Stewart volunteered to be both the Community Quilts and Vice President of the guild. She then passed around the Guild Board Sign-up sheet and stated we still need someone for the newsletter position as well as the President position. Program: Donna introduced our speakers, Mark and Sherry Werum. Mark started the program off with an introduction to his passion of building

instruments. He showed a Mandolin he made and played a tune to introduce his wife Sherry to the guild. She came

out in a beautiful homemade dress from the 1700s. Her program shared with us the fascinating history of American quilts from 1776 through 1863. Details like why certain materials were used when, as well as how dyes were made at certain times, and how they affected the quilts of those eras fascinated the entire crowd. Between the stories and the quilts she displayed everyone was entertained.

Show and Tell: Marylyn Lanham showed us a sewn sewing bag that used English Paper Piecing and then a Round Tuit Christmas panel that was blue and white. Darlene McClure showed a wild animal panel quilt and a pink green and cream diamond quilt. Linda Brunner showed an community guilt made with three inch strips and a Boxy Stars quilt made from the two and a half in strip exchange, using a Bonnie Hunter pattern. Sandy Farrell shared a four square rick rack quilt and a Thimble Berry quilt that were both Round Tuits. Donna Dolan shared a story about how she and her granddaughter made a braided fabric basket. Mary Harpold shared a 400 circle quilt that measured 100 inches by 100 inches. Donna Grosbeck shared two guilts her daughter, Laurie, made. The first one was pink and the second, similar, but yellow. Both will be community quilts. Peg Edwards shared a prayer flag banner she made for her son's wedding that is coming up. Leslie Zimmerschied shared a pumpkin wall hanging that was a completed Round Tuit.
