2 ½" strip Fabric Exchange Civil War fabric or Thimbleberries small print Monday, March 2, 2015

You can exchange up to 28 (2 %" strips = 2 yards)

Strips are cut on the cross grain (selvage to selvage) and must measure at least 40°. (If using stash and/or fat quarters cut and sew the 2 %° strips together until the strip equals at least 40° and count as 1 strip.

Roll the strips into a jelly roll to bring to the exchange. Jelly roll consists of 28 strips or less. Remember the number of strips you have so that you get that many strips in the exchange.

Take home a variety of Civil War or Thimbleberries 2 ½" for your next project! Sign up today, or call Daenette More 307-220-3794 to participate. We need to know how much space is needed for the exchange. Try it! You'll like it!

January 5, 2015: Penny Morris

After Sue Frierich welcomed us, her Ice Breaker question was, "What did you cook for dinner?" We had one visitor. Announcements: April 10-12 Harriman UFO Retreat, cost \$45.00 bring your own bedding, and towels. Pot Luck meals. Capacity 60 quilters Sign- up sheet beginning next meeting. June 15 Annette Ornelas class and trunk show. Class from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at LCCC (\$25.00 members; \$35.00 non-members). The project is "Ribbons and Roses" Sign ups have begun. Her Trunk Show will be that evening at our regular meeting. March 2 we will have a special CHQ meeting beginning at 6 p.m. and lasting 3 hours. Pam Damour will be our program, and later that week will present hands on classes at Blakeman Vacuuming & Sewing. Members can order Fons & Porter Magazine as part of a special sign up through the guild. See Mary Ellen. The next Quilts of Valor meeting will be January 22 at the Quilted Corner. They need backing material or donations of money. The National Quilts of Valor Quilt Day is February 7. Reservations required, limited seating. Talk to Linda Herget Panel Challenge was announced and a whole cloth panel was displayed. Finished Panels are due in May.

Program: Penny Morris gave a trunk show and talked to us about "Entering and winning at large Quilt Shows." How do you decide if your quilt is good enough to enter a contest? Penny stated that you will probably feel that it is special as you are making it. All you can do is try. All shows are subjective. The main thing to remember about entering a quilt show like Houston is to pay attention to the rules and deadlines. There is no leniency. They are serious about deadlines, categories, size and qualification of age of the quilt. Penny entered a beautiful quilt at Houston in 2008 and was accepted by the photograph, but was disqualified because it was deemed there was not enough quilting on the project. Some FYI things to do before entering and sending quilt for judging.

1. Have the quilt appraised. This is necessary for insurance purposes, which is required. Not all insurance companies will insure quilts. See Penny.

2. Pay strict attention to deadline of submission and send the quilt in plenty of time to get there by the deadline.

3. When mailing a quilt it is suggested that you insure it only for the deductible and not the entire value of the quilt to make the package less interesting to thieves.

4. Prepare the quilt for display before mailing it. Get all the loose threads trimmed etc.

Penny then showed us a beautiful array of machine pieced, hand appliqué and embellished quilts. Penny likes hand quilting best. "Quilts change memories into something you can touch". She adds something personal or a memory to each quilt. Penny was asked about her experiences at Houston and talked about the exhibits. There are many shows within the main show. Penny's parting remarks were "Go to Houston!"

Show and tell: The Virginia Dale Opportunity quilt was presented to CHQ member Laraine Hutchison who bought the winning ticket! Congratulations Laraine! Round Robin groups were photographed with their beginning blocks. A Round table topper was shown by Sue Frierich, who also showed a paper pieced block of the month block that she made and will teach at Around the Block soon. It used a rainbow of solids colors. "Bizarre Hexagons" was shown by Daenette More. It is a twin sized quilt that used chevron fabric cut into multicolored hexagons for her granddaughter, Lindsay. Donna Dolan showed her granddaughter's fabric paint and a final salute quilt for the VA. Door Prizes were won by: Mary Harpold, Florence Brown and some other folks, too.

The cost for members is \$45, for nonmembers \$55. This will be a sleep, cook, and sew retreat. Be sure to bring your own linens. They only have room for 34 people so be sure to sign up soon. Annette Ornelas is offering a class "Ribbons and Roses" on Monday, June 15 from 9 – 4 at LCCC. The cost for members is \$25, non-members \$35. The pattern for the class is in the book "Peeled back Patchwork," which is available in our Library. Daenette is organizing a fabric exchange for the March 2 meeting. If you would like to participate please bring up to 28 strips of fabric (2 1/2" X 40" WOF) to the meeting. The fabric should be Civil War, Thimbleberries or Kansas City Troubles. Roll the strips into a jelly roll for the exchange. March 2 the speaker will be Pam Damour and the meeting will start at 6 p.m. instead of 7 p.m. Be sure to mark your calendars. Joyce Holub would like some suggestions on books you would like her to order for our Library. She is making a list of our library books to publish on our website for member information. Carole Gardner has Community Quilt kits and tops that need quilting. This is an important part of our club and we hope you will all help with this chore. Carole has done a great job of getting kits together and bringing them to each meeting. Liz Escobedo has sent out an email request for a patriotic guilt donation. We will have more information at the next couple meetings. The Quilt Show meetings have been moved to the 3rd Monday of the month for February and March. (2/16/15 & 3/16/15) They will meet at the Church at 6 p.m. The members got their first look at this year's Opportunity Quilt. It was constructed by Bea Dersham, Linda Brunner and Sandy Farrell and was guilted by Debbie Przymus. Tickets should be available for sale at the March 2 meeting. Tonight was the second exchange of Round Robin blocks. If you have any questions please contact Wendy Ray. It was discussed that the club should have an inventory of greeting cards to be sent out to our members as needed. We will have a variety of cards available and we just need each of you to notify us of events that would need a card sent. There will also be a column in the newsletter titled "Caring Corner" to let you know when we hear of a concern. Tracy Wilson announced the WSQG retreat will be held Friday, April 24 at 3 p.m. until Sunday, April 26. This will be at LCCC. There are no overnight dorm rooms available for this retreat. They will have potluck lunches and dinners. Tracy will be offering a class called "Fantasy Flowers". Thank you to Darlene McClure and Genelle Warner for hosting tonight. The cookies and drinks are always a treat.

Program: Tonight's speaker was Debbie Przymus on the Accuquilt GO cutting system. She demonstrated how the Accuquilt system works. It not only cuts straight strips in seconds but also curved pieces and up to 6 layers of fabric each time. You have to buy the special dies for each shape or

size of cut. They have very sharp blades set in foam, Debbie says she's had hers for years and the blades are still sharp. Each die pack comes with patterns showing different ways to use the guilt blocks. When you are cutting the fabric you need to pay special attention to which way the fabric stretches so you don't get a wonky cut. Some dies are marked "Block on Board" (BOB) which means all the pieces for the block are done with one cut. When you cut out pieces like for a half square triangle the piece already has the notch cut off the tip which saves trimming time after you've sewn the pieces together. Yes – we can all cut out fabric with our rotary cutters or even scissors but if you want to make guilts faster with more accuracy you might want to look into getting one of these machines. The smaller GO Baby might be a good place to start. However they do have an even larger electric one. You can buy the Accuquilt locally at the Quilted Corner, JoAnn's and the guilt shop in Windsor. The Quilted Corner has a Club that meets on the 2nd Thursday of each month at 10:15 a.m. At this time they are doing a Block-ofthe-Month. Thank you Debbie for bringing all the equipment and doing such a nice demonstration of the machine we have all wondered about.
