I had a wonderful visit November 29 with Chris Murphy, president of Crown of Maine Quilters (CMQ) in Freeport Maine. Meeting Chris was like seeing a longtime friend. Chris is doing the CHQ mystery quilt following the steps online. It is good to trade ideas as we are doing the panel challenge.

Chris' sister, Kate, presented ways of getting free quilt patterns online at one of the CMQ meetings. Kate said when a designer creates a pattern using a manufacturer's fabric line, the manufacturer gets the rights to the use those patterns for a year. After that, the copyright returns to the pattern designer.



She showed a picture of a Keepsake kit, "Cleopatra's Fan". The pattern is available at Robert Kaufman website. She also told of a new board game available called "Quilt Show."

The box of quilt items we sent to CMQ was much appreciated. The quilt top from Community quilts will be finished and donated to their dialysis patients' project.

Quilt Show: Linda Herget Quilting Wyoming's Treasures is the theme for this year's quilt show. We will bring wrapped sewing gadgets for the exchange. Also please bring 1 1/2 yard pieces of fleece for Ione Pedersen's granddaughter. She takes them to the premature babies in Denver. December 1 is the party and there is no second meeting in December, so this is the only chance to participate. Panel challenge spoke person, JoEllen Mass, reminded us that May's first meeting is the deadline for Panel Challenge creations. You can do pretty much whatever you want to your panel (No books or aprons) and we'll share them at the first meeting in May. Wendy Ray told us that tonight is the last night that you can sign up for the Round Robin and for the Mystery Quilt "Setting Party." The setting party will have a variety of activities going on. If you have your pieces all sewn, bring your machine and start sewing the top together. There are 10 different ways to put the pieces of the quilt together, so you may just want to get ideas. Let Wendy know if you are coming. It's at 6:00 at the Cottonwood Room at the library on December 8th. Judy Gilmore reminded us that 2015 Rosters and membership cards are ready and to remember to pick them up. Donna Dolan led us in our embroidery training

for the night. Several of our most capable embroidering members sat at different tables and gave us guidance as we shared different embroidery techniques and points. Many of our Members shared show and tell that included embroidered items and other things. During Show and Tell, Wendy Ray showed the projects she made from last month's instructions. Lois Miller shared some antique embroidered pieces many with gorgeous lace edgings, and one that was completely crocheted. JoEllen Mass showed her black and white tree skirt, that came out really nice. Ann Stangl shared her jelly roll quilt, and Helen Jarvis brought in two Advent wall hangings. There were pockets to hold ornaments for each day and a tree to hang the ornaments on as they are taken out of the pockets. Very nice. Deb Hottle showed here Round Tuits and a Block-of-the-Month tree guilt. Donna Dolan shared community quilts she made for her "adopted family" and some very nice embroidered items. Daenette More shared an embroidered quilt and Round Robin quilt. Chris Voeller brought her Judy Neimeyer guilt and Mary Levenhagen showed her "bright" tree skirt and baby quilt. Judy Gilmore showed her scrappy Sun and Shadow's quilt and Meredith Dexter and Debbie Pryzmus each showed quilts. It was a great display.
