

Round Robin Reminder: Wendy Ray

Ladies, I had the privilege of looking at different Round Robin pieces the other night at the Guild meeting. I was surprised to see how some of you interpreted the rules. Hopefully this round's instructions will be easy to follow. Round Four: Make a pieced, appliquéd, or embroidered border any width that goes

around the whole block, or the block can be set on-point and the setting triangles can be pieced or plain with appliqué or embroidered. Bring to the 1st meeting in April (April 6th) for the fourth pass along. If you can not attend please make arrangements for it to be there.



Sue Frerich welcomed CHQ members and three visitors to the meeting tonight. Announcements: Sue said the CHQ Retreat at the Harriman conference center will be April 10-12. Cost for this UFO retreat is \$45 for members and \$55 for non-members. There will be a class taught by Annette Ornelas on Monday, June 15, at LCCC. The cost will be \$25 for members and \$35 for non-members. The class is from 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Annette will present a program that evening at our regular CHQ meeting beginning at 7 p.m. A suggestion was made by Jeannie Wilson that CHQ purchase a hands free microphone for use at meetings for the ease of the presenters. Sue reported that the church has been saving part of our rent money toward upgrades to the sound system in the room we use for our meetings and they liked the idea. Daenette More collected completed Community Quilts and handed out kits to be sewn together. Linda Herget reminded all who purchased challenge quilts to be working on them so they are ready for the quilt show. She also reported eight tops were completed at the is her favorite), with a sharp blade, the unruled (back side) Quilts of Valor workday held on February 7. Daenette More reminded us that there will be a fabric exchange at the March 2 meeting. Bring up to two yards of fabric cut into 2 ½ inch strips (28 strips is the maximum to exchange) cut width of fabric (at least 40 inches long). Bring them jelly roll style. Suggested fabrics are stash fabrics, civil war





prints, Kansas Troubles, small print Thimbleberry fabrics. You will be able to trade for as many strips as you bring. Sue Frerich showed the stack of greeting cards that Linda Bruner brought. CHQ will use these cards to send notes to members that need get well wishes or notes that we are thinking of them. Laraine Hutchison brought Linus Quilt kits tonight for people to take home and put together.

Donna Dolan introduced our special guest and presenter. Marci Baker, from Fort Collins, CO., who is a nationally recognized guilting teacher, designer, publisher and more. She has a math and engineering background, is a lifetime sewer, beginning with her own clothes, and then starting quilting 30 years ago. In 1984 she took a sampler class and when they got to the tumbling blocks she thought there must be an easier way to create them. She emphasized using good tools. Her favorite tools are: A rotary cutter (Olfa of a self healing cutting mat, (Olfa is her favorite), a 6" x 12" ruler, (a longer ruler slips), vinyl cutting strips (placed on the ruler that create and edge the fabric rests against to prevent the fabric from slipping while cutting), Clover silk pins, Starty-Stoppies (the small bits of fabric you start stitching on and ending on when you are chain piecing), and a good seam ripper. She demonstrated many techniques she uses to make them work. Marci's website has lots of great learning opportunities and products including a blog and a monthly newsletter: quiltwithmarcibaker.com/marcis-bloq.

Her presentation included tips like selecting values of fabric (light and dark first, then mediums), foundation paper piecing (online downloadable instructions available), and seam ripping (pull the fabric into the blade). You can find more "Tips" videos on her website. She shared many quilts with us for a delightful program! Thank you, Marci!
