
"Pincushions come in all shapes and sizes, but the tomato is the design that prevails as the classic. But why a tomato of all things? Turns out it's not random: There's actually a reason for the tomato design, and it dates back to the Victorian era.

The first ever documented mention of a generic pincushion dates back to the Middle Ages. Of course, in those days, they were more whimsically called "pimpilowes", "pyn pillows," and "pin-poppets." The pincushion was invented as a practical aid for storing pins and needles, but it also showcased one's collection of pins and needles. {Needles were costly, after all} But the less-iconic shapes of dolls, birds, and prettily-packaged boxes left something to be desired.

Enter the time-honored tomato. According to tradition, placing a tomato on the mantel of a new home ensured prosperity by warding off evil spirits. When tomatoes were out of season, people weren't totally out of luck: They simply improvised with red material, sawdust, and a little bit of ingenuity.

A lady of the Victorian era would take immense pride in a parlor room stocked with shelves upon shelves of pincushions, but the tomato was always the crown jewel of her collection. Since then, we've been piercing our pins into stuffed fabric tomatoes without question. But it's "sew" much more fun to know where they came from, am I right?"


2023 Quilt Show Corner - Daenette More, Chairman

We still need people to sign up. Hopefully one of these Colors (Months) will fit with something you've been wanting to make.



2023 Quilt Show Information

CHQ will be presenting our quilt show at the First United Methodist Church on August 17, 18 and 19, 2023. The quilt show is open to the public at a nominal admission of \$2. Quilts on display will be from CHQ members only.

Each member will be allowed to enter up to 3 quilts plus a challenge quilt if they are participating in the challenge.

Select only ONE category for each quilt that is entered. To determine the size of the quilt, add width plus length. Categories are:

Pieced, small (Less than 36")	Art (any size)		
Pieced, medium (37" – 132")	Applique/Embroidery (any size)		
Pieced, large (over 133")	Challenge quilt		
Quilting, machine or hand (this category is if you only want the			
quilting considered, not the piecing)			

Please write a short statement about your quilt of no more than 150 words. It MUST include the size of your quilt and can be what the inspiration was, original design or pattern name, interesting history or details, who quilted it, if not you. This must be submitted via e-mail or regular mail *no later than July 17, 2023*.

- PLACE EACH QUILT IN ITS OWN WHITE DRAW STRING TRASH BAG.
- One quilt per bag.
- Attach Quilt Label from the Quilt Show Entry Form securely to your quilt.
- Also print your name and size of the quilt on the bag.

Quilts will be collected at the Methodist Church on *Monday, August 14,* 2023 between 6:30 and 8:30 p.m.

You may pick up your quilt on Saturday, August 19, 2023 at 3:30 pm. The take-down crew needs time to get the quilts down and in their bags, then organized for pickup. Remember to have your Quilt Claim Form(s).

Quilts may be for sale. Twenty-five percent (25%) of the price will go to CHQ.

Visitors to the quilt show will be given ballots to vote for their favorite quilt in each category. Ballots from Thursday and Friday will be tabulated and awards of first and second place will be displayed on the quilts before opening on Saturday.

The Opportunity quilt ticket will be drawn on Saturday just before closing but ticket holder need not be present.
