Because of the extra effort of the Highway patrolman, they recovered their wedding quilt. It was fun to be part of such a happy story. Kudos to the patrolman for going the second mile in doing his duties. It brought this quote to mind. "Always do right. This will gratify some people, and astonish the rest. Mark Twain"
