Fabric Requirements: Dark Fabric: 1 1/4 yards Light Fabric: 1 1/2 yards Medium Fabric: 1 1/4 yards

Binding: ½ yard.

Things to know: Medium Fabric is your outer border, but your Dark Fabric would be a great accent binding. I plan on using my Dark Fabric

Total of 6 clues. Each month I will hand out the next set of instructions. I will be at the CHQ meeting at 6:30 during visiting time. I will give a 5-10 minute demo of that months instructions. Please bring the previous month's piecing to the meeting (or a picture) to get the next set of instructions. If you cannot make the meeting, please send me a photo of your completed step and I will email you the next set of instructions.

At the end of the 6 months you will have 2 months to complete the top for our show and tell.

You will be amazed at everyone's fabric choices.

February: Month 1

March: Month 2, bring in Month 1

April: Month 3, bring in Month 2

May: Month 4, bring in Month 3 June: Month 5, bring in Month 4

June: Month 5, bring in Month 4

July: Month 6 The final set of instructions, bring in Month 5

August: Finish up your top, quilting, and binding.

September: Show and Tell, Completed Quilts are best, but the finished top is okay!!!

My supply order goes in on the 1st and 15th if you would like to place an order for supplies. I do have sewing needles and thread in stock.

What we like to see is when you do your backing leave a 4 inch extra all 4 sides so the quilt top has backing to hook on the frame as well as our clamps to clamp from the side and not interfere with the quilting of the longarm

Fun facts about quilting

- "Quilt" is derived from the Latin word culcita, which means "stuffed sack."
- The earliest depiction of quilting was discovered in Egypt; it was an ivory figurine of a pharaoh wearing quilted clothing, ca. 3400 BC.
- Quilted clothing was popular in Europe, especially under chain-mail armor for soldiers. It kept the metal from rusting and kept the knights comfy under all their heavy gear.
- European settlers brought quilting to the Americas, and the earliest-known quilt made in America is from 1704.
- During the expansion into the Western United States, quilts were used as window coverings, doors, and walls for temporary housing as well as currency for pioneers.
- "Quilting bees" originated in the midwest United States during the 1800s, where a lack of neighbors and a need for socializing drew women together to finish quilts and make new friends.
