February 5 Program - Marci Rulon How to Enlarge or Reduce Quilt Blocks

We've all faced the problem of having to make quilt blocks fit in a design we wanted to make. Sometimes we wanted our favorite block to be larger sometimes it was just too big for the plan. We've tried using a copier to guess the percentage we needed to get the size we wanted with some success, but tonight we learned the

actual way to enlarge and reduce those blocks and got the chance to know Marci Rulon a little better.

First of all, Marci Rulon loves numbers. (Lucky for us, because she's our Treasurer.) What a treat to hear all of Marci's techniques to make quilt blocks fit **Anywhere**.

- "Quilt" is derived from the Latin word culcita, which means "stuffed sack."
- The earliest depiction of quilting was discovered in Egypt; it was an ivory figurine of a pharaoh wearing quilted clothing, ca. 3400 BC.
- Quilted clothing was popular in Europe, especially under chain-mail armor for soldiers. It kept the metal from rusting and kept the knights comfy under all their heavy gear.

LAKE

- European settlers brought quilting to the Americas, and the earliest-known quilt made in America is from 1704.
- During the expansion into the Western United States, quilts were used as window coverings, doors, and walls for temporary housing as well as currency for pioneers.
- "Quilting bees" originated in the midwest United States during the 1800s, where a lack of neighbors and a need for socializing drew women together to finish quilts and make new friends.
