

was impressed by the organization of the process and accuracy of the finished product. Judy's process takes what looks like an extremely complicated guilt and breaks it down into a set of easily taught techniques to achieve highly accurate results. Michele has now completed over 25 Judy quilts with several more in process. Michele enjoys helping others, and teaching quilting allows

her to incorporate two things she loves to do. She strives to connect to each student and give them her personal attention. Asking questions is how we learn,

so Michele never tires of a student's questions. The greatest joy for Michele as a quilting

instructor, is to see the smile on the faces of her students when they have completed their projects and realize what they have accomplished.

Our top priority is accurately recording and reporting your item sales. You can help us by using the "CHQ Boutique" Donation form 2025" to record your

items, letting us know how your donations will be sold (total club donation or 75%/25% split), and labeling each item with a price.

### **CHQ BOUTIQUE ITEM SUGGESTIONS 2025**

This list is just a few ideas of items that you may want to make of the Boutique for the 2025 Quilt Show. It is in no way meant to be all-inclusive. We know from past shows that members of CHQ are very creative and always surprise us with beautiful and innovative items so follow your own creative spirit or get some inspiration from our list.

Bags & purses - great sellers

Bags of scraps - especially great if sorted by color. Bags of selvages.

Knitted, crocheted, embroidered, hand stitched items.

Small Christmas tree decorations and all things Christmas. We have a special Christmas section for Christmas related items.

Kitchen/Dining related - aprons,, table runners, coasters, potholders, bowl cozies, wine sleeves, tea towels, place mats & napkins, etc etc.

Orphan blocks.

Scarves, greeting cards, pet quilts & pet accessories.

Rice bags for aches and pains, wall hangings, handmade jewelry.

Dolls and dolls' clothes.

Slightly used quilt & sewing related books.

Decorator pillows, pillowcases, wallets.

Leftover stash fabrics. Those fabrics that you know you will never use but are so good that another quilter will have to have them.

We hope that you will also want to donate some baked goods for the bakery section of the Boutique.

We wish we could sell your large quilts in the Boutique but, unfortunately, large quilts do not sell well in that venue. This is partially because many of the people who visit our show are quilters and love to purchase smaller items but do not purchase large quilts. Another reason that we cannot offer larger quilts for sale is that we do not have space to display them appropriately. If you wish to sell a larger quilt, please enter it in the show and mark it for sale

### **CHQ BOUTIQUE INFORMATION 2025**

Once again this year there will be a boutique as part of the Quilt Show on August 21, 22 and 23, 2025. All members are encouraged to participate by donating something for this sale. You may do this in three different ways:

- 1. Donate items and give CHQ 100% of the proceeds.
- 2. Donate items and share with CHQ you get 75% of the proceeds and CHQ gets 25%.
- 3. Hang a quilt in the show and designate it for sale. You get 75%, CHQ gets 25%.

100% donated items: All proceeds go to CHQ. The donor determines and marks the price on the item. There is no limit to the number of items that can be donated. Leftover items are to be picked up at the end of the show.

75%/25% split donated items: 75% of proceeds to donor; 25% to CHQ. The donor determines and marks the price on the items. No limit to the number of items that can be donated. Leftover items are to be picked up at the end of the show.

CHQ will provide price tags. Please use these tags if possible. List all your donated items on the attached entry form and bring with your items. Bring items to the church at the regular CHQ meeting on the first Monday in July and/or August. You may also bring items to the church on Thursday the 21st at 9:00 a.m. Additionally, if you are unable to get your boutique items to the church at any of the designated times, please call Devonna Reiner at 307-631-1080 or Sue Miller at 307-214-5504 and we will arrange to get your boutique items.

Quilts hanging in the show and marked "For Sale": Exhibitor will mark the quilt for sale and mark the price on the quilt. If sold, the purchaser will pay for the quilt at the boutique. The exhibitor will be notified that a quilt has been sold. NO quilt will be taken down until the end of the show. Sold quilts will be delivered to the boutique area when taken down after the show. The purchaser must present the receipt to the boutique on Saturday after the show ends to claim the quilt.

In addition to your handmade items, baked goods will be sold in the Boutique. 100% of the proceeds of these baked goods will be donated to CHQ. Please bring your baked items to the boutique area in the church at 9:00 a.m. on any of the show days. There is no need to mark these items. The committee will price the baked goods in order to preserve consistency.

A huge THANK YOU to all members participating in the Boutique.


