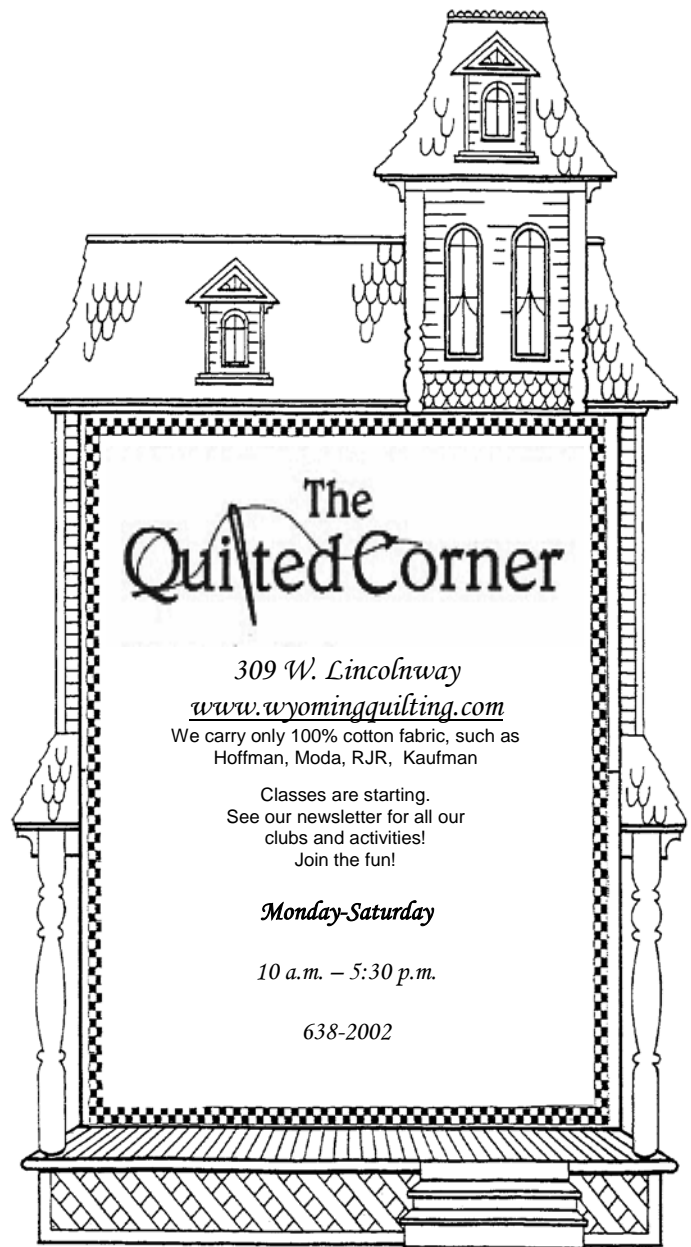

The hours for the quilt show are Thursday, Aug. 25, 4-8 p.m. (free admission) and Friday and Saturday, Aug. 26 and 27, 10 a.m. – 4 p.m., (admission \$2). We will have the vendors on Saturday as well as demonstrations.

After 3 p.m. Saturday we will have the drawings for the raffle quilt and the Patchwork Prance. Also, winning bidders can pay for and claim Silent Auction items. If you have entered quilts or have Silent Auction items that didn't sell, you will be able to pick them up soon after the show closes and the take-down crew has them ready.

You are exempt from admission fees the day you are working at the show, but not if you come back later in the day. Florence Brown has a few openings for hostesses, 637-5248. If you have any questions about hostessing beginning Aug. 23, please call Becky Bogart, 433-8093.

Aug. 15, at our guild meeting, is the deadline for submitting quilt show entry forms and fees. Quilts can also be brought in then or dropped off with Bea Dersham Aug. 16-21, 637-7195. Remember, quilts will be hung in the order entry forms are received until we run out of space. If there is room for quilts with entry forms submitted after Aug. 15, they will not be listed in the program.
