



# 2011 Quilt Show and Silent Auction\_\_\_\_\_

A new aspect of this year's quilt show will be the Quilt Sale, in addition to the Silent Auction. You will have the option of listing for sale the one to three quilts you enter in the show. You set a price and CHQ will take a 20 percent commission if your quilt sells. Quilts cannot have been entered in previous CHQ shows. A potential buyer cannot put a hold on a quilt but must pay in full. Quilts will remain hanging until the end of the show. An out-of-town buyer will be asked to pay shipping fees at the time they pay for the quilt. Any quilt entry you do not wish to sell will be marked "Not for Sale."

This year's Silent Auction will be limited to three items per guild member. We will have lots of room to display items next to individual bid sheets. We are going to borrow the eBay idea of a "Buy Now Price." This means, in addition to setting the lowest bid you will take, you will have the option of also setting the highest bid. If a buyer meets that highest bid, they can pay the amount on the spot and take the item with them. This should encourage out of town visitors to peruse the Silent Auction items. CHQ will take a 20 percent commission on all items sold.

Adell VanPatten-Gorny and Laraine Hutchison are in charge of the Quilt Sale and Silent Auction and will soon have forms ready. Meanwhile, look over UFOs you might finish, quilts and quilted things in your closet and see what you have that might attract buyers. The show will be Aug. 25-27 at Allison Hall, First United Methodist Church.
